

Tamplighter

An Easter Message based on the Gospel of Matthew 28:1-10

On the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary saw light peeking over the horizon as they rushed to the tomb where Jesus' body was laid. It was the third day since Jesus was crucified, died, and was buried. They were among the many women who had followed Jesus from Galilee and provided for him during his ministry. They were witnesses to healings, miracles and teachings by him. They had followed him to Jerusalem and stood by him through his crucifixion, looking on from afar. They witnessed Joseph of Arimathea bury Jesus and watched as a large stone sealed his tomb.

I believe, the women had little hope of getting close to the tomb or even getting inside. According to Matthew, at the request of the religious leaders, Pilate had ordered Roman soldiers to guard the tomb so no one could steal the body and tell people, "See, he has been raised from the dead just as he said." Unlike in the other Easter accounts, in Matthew's, the women didn't carry with them the customary spices to anoint their beloved Jesus' body. Perhaps they believed getting past the guards and removing the large stone would be impossible for them. It was just another thing added to their grief and sorrow. Still, they rushed to see the tomb to continue their vigil, unwavering in their faithfulness to Jesus even in death.



As the two women neared the tomb, suddenly all heaven broke loose. The quiet of the dawn was interrupted by the shuddering of the earth and by the descending of an angel from heaven. Before their astonished eyes, the angel rolled the great stone away and calmly sat on it. The angel's display of power and the appearance of the dazzling white clothes pierced the shadows of their grief and sorrow. The two Marys looked at each other, remembering how the earth also shook at Jesus' death. "What is happening?" Mary Magdalene thought. "Could it be?" the other Mary thought.

The angel, ignoring the Roman guards who had frozen in fear, turned to the women and said, "Do not be afraid. You are looking for Jesus. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay." As they looked inside, suddenly something inside the women broke loose and their hearts swelled in fear and in joy. It was empty! It was empty! With astonishment and wonder, they heard the angel say, "Go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." Immediately, the women turned and ran from the angel and the empty tomb. They ran as fast as they could to share the good news of resurrection that had been handed over to them by God's emissary. Jesus is Risen just as he said! He goes ahead of us to Galilee just as he promised! There we will see him just as he promised!

Hurrying along, the two Marys marveled that the inconceivable was somehow possible and plausible. They recalled Jesus' words of promise during one of his teachings, "For God all things are possible." Suddenly the unfathomable Reality of a God who can and does bring hope out of despair, light out of darkness and life out of death met them on their way. Jesus, the hope, light, and life of the whole world, met them in their trembling fear and joy and said, "Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me." Their hearts burning inside, the two Marys knelt, took hold of Jesus' feet, and worshipped him.

Dear people, on Easter Sunday, God gathers us together with Mary Magdalene and the other Mary to worship through Word and Sacrament the wonder, the mystery, the power of God's mercy and love in Christ, to role away the heavy stones and to empty the tombs of our lives and to bring new life. Easter is a celebration that all heaven breaks loose upon our lives, through the love, life and light of God in Jesus Christ, who brings forth for you and for all the earth, hope out of despair, light out of darkness, and life out of death.

Easter is also a celebration of God commissioning us along with the two Marys to go and to share this good news that the crucified Jesus is Risen! To proclaim that the crucified and risen Jesus goes ahead to the places we live out our daily lives - our jobs, our homes, our schools, our communities. As we go on our way, the crucified and risen Jesus will meet us there, assuring us that God did, does, and will always act to overcome the hurt and harm in our lives with healing and resurrection. Jesus will meet us with healing and resurrection in a funny text from a friend. In a thoughtful thank you card from a student. In a much-welcomed visit from a family member. In the sun breaking through a cloudy day. In the faces of those who break bread together on their knees.

Easter Sunday is the day the Lord has made. Along with the two Marys, Peter and all the disciples of Jesus throughout all of history, we now hear, touch, see, taste, sing, and share in Jesus' resurrection. We receive his unconditional and self-giving love, his everlasting and abundant life for you and for all the earth. A Blessed Easter to you all!

Seven Stanzas at Easter

During the 1950's, John Updike worshipped at a Lutheran church in Marblehead, MA, a church similar in some respects to the Lutheran church of his youth in Pennsylvania. When the congregation sponsored a Religious Arts Festival and offered a \$100 prize for the best artwork, Updike submitted the poem "Seven Stanzas at Easter." He won and received the \$100 which he promptly gave back to the church and over the years "Seven Stanzas at Easter" has become a much-loved poem.

Make no mistake: if he rose at all It was as His body; If the cell's dissolution did not reverse, the molecule reknit, The amino acids rekindle, The Church will fall.

It was not as the flowers, Each soft spring recurrent; It was not as His Spirit in the mouths and fuddled eyes of the Eleven apostles; It was as His flesh; ours.

The same hinged thumbs and toes The same valved heart That—pierced—died, withered, paused, and then regathered Out of enduring Might New strength to enclose.

Let us not mock God with metaphor, Analogy, sidestepping, transcendence, Making of the event a parable, a sign painted in the faded Credulity of earlier ages: Let us walk through the door.

The stone is rolled back, not papier-mache, Not a stone in a story, But the vast rock of materiality that in the slow grinding of Time will eclipse for each of us The wide light of day.

And if we have an angel at the tomb, Make it a real angel, Weighty with Max Planck's quanta, vivid with hair, opaque in The dawn light, robed in real linen Spun on a definite loom.

Let us not seek to make it less monstrous, For our own convenience, our own sense of beauty, Lest, awakened in one unthinkable hour, we are embarrassed By the miracle, And crushed by remonstrance.






