

# Lamplighter

"I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing." John 15:5



The last Sunday of April we sang for our hymn of the day, *ELW #447 O Blessed Spring*. The first verse is: "O blessed spring, where word and sign embrace us into Christ the Vine: here Christ enjoins each one to be a branch on his life-giving Tree." O blessed spring, indeed!! I don't know about you, but I am totally embracing the new warmth in the air and the budding creation all around us in these past weeks. After what seems like a very strange winter, the signs of spring blooming around us are a welcome sight for these winter-tired eyes.

I am particularly enjoying seeing the buds of green pop out on the trees this spring. I am reminded of of the many Psalms in scripture that speak of all creation singing in praise to God. When I see the trees popping with green again, I imagine them singing anew, and even singing praise to the Tree of Life, Jesus the Christ, who pours light and life into all creation. So, I find myself these days giving thanks to God for all the trees of nature which give shelter and food and create oxygen for many living creatures. I give thanks to God for giving us and all creation the Tree of life, Jesus Christ, who is our mystical shelter and food and who gives us the breath of life. I thank God that here in our faith community, and in faith communities around the world, Christ enjoins each one of us to be a branch on his life-giving Tree.

So, I offer for your reflection and meditation throughout this blessed spring an icon of Christ the Vine. Cut it out and hang it up on your fridge, on the bathroom mirror, even on the dash of your vehicle, or put it in your wallet or purse or backpack or briefcase. When your eyes happen upon it, throughout the course of our day, may you be reminded and give thanks that Christ has willingly and graciously and lovingly connected himself to you and all creation. Why is this so important? Why might this warrant a moment of daily and intentional reflection on our part?

Because, dear people of God, without this life-giving link to Jesus Christ, our inner strength and balance, our spiritual growth and vitality, our ability to bear the fruit of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, self-control, etc amidst life's challenges is can become limited, if not utterly withered. In nature, a branch not connected to a vine is a dead branch not bearing fruit of any kind. So it is in faith. May this image of Christ the Vine, intimately connected to his disciples, remind you and me and anyone who gazes upon its mystery and beauty that we are not dead branches, but we are the living and fruit-bearing branches connected to the source of life, light, love and healing – Jesus Christ. Christ is the true vine, we are his branches, interwoven together into community, strengthened and empowered to bear good fruit that nourishes and feeds our lives and the lives of those we encounter at work, home, school, church, and in our neighborhoods.

Dear Salem Congregation,

At our annual staff review meeting on September 25, 2023, the Mutual Ministry Committee considered my request for a Sabbatical leave in 2024 for a period of 10 weeks. After affirmation of this plan and much discussion, they voted to make a recommendation to the Congregation Council that I be granted Sabbatical leave in 2024 for a period of 10 weeks. The Congregation Council approved the Sabbatical leave at the November 9, 2023 meeting. The Congregation approved the Sabbatical with the approval of the 2024 Budget at our Annual Meeting on November 19, 2024. The specific dates were set in January 2024 for the Sabbatical to be June 3 through August 11.

I am very grateful to Mutual Ministry, the Council and the Congregation for granting me this time of rest and renewal away from my pastoral call and duties. The SWPA Synod guidelines state that a Sabbatical leave for pastors is a gift granted by a congregation to its pastor intended for their mutual benefit. I certainly feel that way – gifted and blessed by Salem people.

### For the Congregation

The mission of the congregation benefits from the opportunity to be re-empowered through caring for the ministry of the congregation in the absence of a pastor or deacon in addition to the presence following sabbatical leave of clergy whose skills and creativity have been renewed or enhanced through a time for reflection, spiritual reencounter, renewal, and community. (SWPA Sabbatical Policy)

### For the Pastor

The ministry of the clergy benefits from the personal renewal that comes from an extended time for reflection, spiritual re-encounter, renewal, and community. (SWPA Sabbatical Policy)

It is my hope and prayer that this time of Sabbatical will indeed be a blessing and benefit of rest, renewal and reempowerment for both of us. I pray that during this time, you as a congregation will also reflect on ministry and mission for us as we go forward together. I certainly will be reflecting upon this. It seems fast approaching. So, if you have any concerns, questions, or would like to get together and visit before I go on Sabbatical leave, please be in touch with me ASAP. I would be happy to visit and talk about the Sabbsatical, about church, about life or whatever you need.

Finally, I am very grateful to my colleagues and friends in the SWPA Synod who will be coming to lead worship and provide pastoral care for you this summer while I am on Sabbatical leave. I have utmost trust in them and know that I leave you in caring hands. As I said at our special meeting in March, I would print the summer pulpit supply schedule for you in the May Lamplighter. 




